

We Are Committed to quality communication with our school families. Families receive a student handbook with administrative policies and information. A weekly newsletter keeps all the information up to date and an annual calendar of events is provided for the entire school year.

Report cards are distributed four times a year for grades K through 8 and progress reports are sent home quarterly for students in grades 2 through 8 which inform parents of each child's development in academics and behavior. In November, Parent/Teacher conferences are held to give parents an opportunity to discuss their child's academic progress. A conference is required for each child. Parents are encouraged to request appointments for additional conferences if they have questions about their child's progress or behavior.

Important Improvements have taken place at Holy Trinity, including a new playground, new computer lab, and many new classroom furnishings. A new gymnasium will be completed in the fall of 2007 that will be used as a P.E. classroom and for our basketball and volleyball teams.

Community Service is an important part of our school's curriculum. Each class undertakes an annual project that helps the less fortunate by providing food, clothing, money, or other needs.



Holy Trinity welcomes students of any sex, race, color, national and ethnic origin. Every student enjoys the same rights, privileges, programs and activities available through the school. Students and parents are required to subscribe to the school's philosophy and agree to abide by the education and discipline policies and regulations set by the school and the Archdiocese.
